Whereas, Acts of the Legis-13 lature do not become effective until 90 days after 14 adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 15 Whereas, the trustees of public water supplies must take effective measures to protect the health 16 17 and well-being of citizens who rely upon those water supplies; and 18 19 Whereas, nuisance growths of algae in public wa-20 ter supplies may most effectively be controlled by the application of copper sulfate during the summer 21 22 months; and 23 Whereas, the Department of Environmental Protection lacks statutory authority to authorize the application of copper sulfate in a timely manner to 24 25 26 control algae growth on public water supplies; and 27 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 28 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 29 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 30 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-31 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 32 therefore, 33 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 34 follows:

Rulemaking concerning algae levels in public water supplies 8 9 shall commence within 30 days of the effective date 10 of this Act. 11 12 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 13 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved. 14 15 STATEMENT OF FACT 16 This amendment establishes an emergency license procedure for the application of copper sulfate or 17 18 related compounds to public water supplies. 19 3357060987
