6 STATEMENT OF FACT

7 The Municipal Public Employees Labor Relations
8 Act has been in existence since 1969 (State Employees
9 Labor Relations - 1974, University of Maine Labor Re-
10 lations Act - 1975 and Judicial Employees Labor Rela-
11 tions Act - 1984). The Maine Labor Relations Board
12 has been rendering decisions and orders since that
13 time affecting municipal, state and University of
14 Maine System employees. The purpose of this bill is
15 to provide funding for an official indexing of the
16 decisions and orders of the Maine Labor Relations
17 Board in matters of prohibited practice complaints,
18 unit determinations and unit clarifications.

19 This bill provides \$10,000 to the Maine Labor Re-
20 lations Board to index the Maine Labor Relations
21 Board decisions for use by their constituency groups.
