CHAPTER 222

AUTOMATED TELEPHONE SOLICITATION

3 §1496. Automated telephone solicitation prohibited; 4 exceptions; penalties 5 1. Prohibition. Except as provided in subsection no person may use an automated telephone system or 6 7 device for the selection and dialing of telephone numbers and playing of recorded messages for purposes 8 9 of: 10 Offering any goods or services for sale; and a state of the second 11 Conveying information on goods or services in 12 soliciting sales or purchases; 5.6 1,3 Soliciting information; 14 Gathering data and statistics; or D. 15 Е, other Promoting or any use related to 16 political campaign. Exceptions. This section does not prohibit 17 the use of an automated telephone system or device 18 19, described under subsection 1 for purposes of: 20 Informing purchasers of the receipt, 21 availability or delivery of goods or services or any delay or other pertinent information on the status of any purchased goods or services; or 22 23 24 Responding to a telephone inquiry initiated by в. 25 any person. 26 Penalty. This bill prohibits the use of automated telephone

systems or devices for purposes of soliciting potential purchasers of goods or services, gathering data or information or for use in a political campaign. The bill does not prohibit the use of such automated systems or devices to inform a person who has already purchased goods of the status of those goods or to respond to a consumer's inquiry. A person who uses an automated telephone system or device in violation of this prohibition commits a Class E crime.
