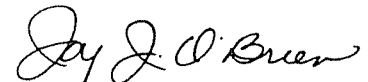

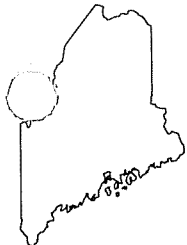

An Act Related to Overcompensation.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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26 MRSA §635 is enacted to read:

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§635. Overcompensation by employer

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If an employer erroneously compensates an employee more than the amount to which the employee is entitled, the employer must negotiate with the employee the method by which the employee is to repay the overcompensated amount. The employer may not reject, without good cause, the employee's preferred method of repayment, if that method is reasonable.

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If an employer fails to negotiate with the employee as provided in this section, the employer forfeits any right or claim to the overcompensated amount.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill allows any employee that has been overcompensated because of an employer's error to participate in deciding how the money is to be returned.
