STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY

Resolve, Authorizing Douglas Wright to Bring a Civil Action against the State for Damages He Sustained As a Result of the Investigation, Prosecution and Trial for Unlawful Sexual Contact.

Douglas Wright; authorized to bring a civil action against the State, 2 its agencies and employees. Resolved: That, notwithstanding any statute or common law to the contrary, Douglas Wright of Belmont, 4 County of Waldo and State of Maine, is authorized to bring suit against the State, its agencies and employees for the alleged 6 negligent investigation of, and prosecution of charges for, unlawful sexual contact. He shall be entitled to recover from 8 the State, its agencies and employees any damages suffered as a proximate result of any negligence, including mental and emotional distress, loss of earnings and the attorney's fees and 10 costs incurred as a consequence of the investigation and charges.

This action shall be brought within one year from the 14 passage of this resolve in the Waldo County Superior Court. Liability and damages, including punitive damages, shall be 16 determined according to state law as in litigation between individuals.

Any judgment, costs and interest that may be recovered in this civil action is payable from the State Treasury on final process issued by the Superior Court or, if applicable, the Supreme Judicial Court. The hearing shall be before a jury and a Justice of the Superior Court. The action shall be governed by the Maine Rules of Civil Procedure, the Maine Rules of Evidence and the common law of this State.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve authorizes Douglas Wright to bring a civil action against the State, its agencies and employees for the alleged negligent investigation of, and prosecution of charges for, unlawful sexual contact. Mr. Wright was acquitted of unlawful sexual contact on October 5, 1989.

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
