STATEMENT OF FACT

4	This bill prohibits the unsolicited transmission of
	telefacsimile messages to request charitable contributions or as
6	advertisements unless the recipient and the sender have a prior
	business or contractual relationship and the recipient has not
8	requested that the transmissions cease. The bill also prohibits
	transmissions of threatening or harassing messages. Violations
10	may result in a civil forfeiture of up to \$500 for each
	transmission.
