(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not 2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and 4 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after 6 existing programs have been forced to cut back or reduce services; and 8 · * * Whereas, there are many individuals in Maine who are on 10 waiting lists for substance abuse services; and Whereas, many young people in Maine are currently at great 12 risk because of a lack of substance abuse services; and 1114171 14 Whereas, the Federal Government has made a substantial 16 commitment to additional intervention strategies to reduce substance abuse; and 18Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts 20 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 22 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, 24 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 26 Appropriation.
