An Act to Establish the Wells Reserve Management Authority.



	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

National Estuarine Reserve Research System authorized by the
federal Coastal Zone Management Act, 16 United States Code,
Section 1461 (1986) and 15 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 921.

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- 1. National system. The mission of the system is to provide opportunities for long-term research, education and interpretation. The goals of the national system are to:
 - A. Ensure a stable environment for research through long-term protection of estuarine reserve resources;
- B. Address coastal management issues identified as significant through coordinated estuarine research within the system;
- 30 C. Enhance public awareness and understanding of the estuarine environment and provide suitable opportunities for public education and interpretation;
- D. Promote federal, state, public and private uses of one or more reserves within the system when such entities conduct estuarine research; and
- E. Conduct and coordinate estuarine research within the system, and gather and make available information necessary for improved understanding and management of estuarine areas.
- 2. Reserve lands. The reserve is situated on the Atlantic coast within the Town of Wells between the Little River on the north and Eldridge Road on the south, east of Route 1 and north of the developed barrier beaches on Drakes Island and Wells Beach. The reserve contains approximately 1,550 acres, including part of the Rachel Carson National Wildlife Refuge and lands owned by the State and the Town of Wells.
- 3. Federal oversight. The federal agency responsible for overview of reserve operation is the federal Marine and Estuarine
 Management Division of the Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource

Management under National Atmospheric Oceanic the and Administration, United States Department of Commerce. agency supports the reserve with federal funds, matched with contributions from the Laudholm Trust, which solicits funds from foundations, corporations and individuals. 6 Sec. 3. Authority established. The Wells Reserve Management Authority is established to provide a management framework for, R and ensure the long-term protection of, the reserve. 10 1. Membership. Composition of the authority is as follows: 12 member representing the state Department Α. Conservation, but not an on-site employee at the reserve, 14 appointed by the Commissioner of Conservation; 16 One member representing the Town of Wells, appointed by the selectmen of the Town of Wells; 18 One member representing the Laudholm Trust, appointed by 20 the trustees of that trust; 22 One member representing the United States Fish and 24 Wildlife Service, but not an on-site employee at reserve, appointed by the Region 5 United States Fish and Wildlife Director; 26 One member with an established reputation in the 28 research field, appointed by the Governor; 30 One member representing the State Planning Office, to serve ex officio, appointed by the director; and 32 One member representing the federal Marine and Estuarine 34 Management Division of the Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management under the National Atmospheric 36 Oceanic Administration, United States Department Commerce, to serve ex officio, appointed by the Secretary of 38 Commerce. 40 The minimum term of appointment for any member is 3 years. 42 The authority, in compliance

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill establishes the Wells Reserve Management Authority to provide a management framework for the Wells National Estuarine Research Reserve that was designated in 1984 as part of the National Estuarine Reserve Research System. The establishment of this authority enhances compliance with federal law and regulation governing the reserve and serves as a formalized commitment on the part of the State to support effective long-term management and protection of the reserve and its resources.
