29 MRSA §252-A, as repealed and replaced by PL 1989, c. 878, Pt. A, \$80, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

§252-A. Disabled veterans; special free license plates

1. Disabled veteran. The Secretary of State on application and upon evidence of payment of the excise tax required by Title 10 36, section 1482, shall issue a registration certificate and set of special designating plates to be used in lieu of regular 12 registration plates to any 100% disabled veteran when that application is accompanied by certification from the United 14 States Veterans Administration or any branch of the United States 16 Armed Forces as to the veteran's disability and receipt of 100% service-connected benefits and that the veteran is permanently confined to a wheelchair or restricted to the use of crutches or 18 braces or otherwise handicapped in such a way that mobility is seriously restricted. A handicap placard must be issued in 20 addition to the disabled veteran registration plate and upon 22 payment of a \$1 fee.

These special designating plates must bear the letters VET which indicate that the vehicle is owned by a disabled veteran.

2. Purple Heart recipient. If a disabled veteran who is eligible under subsection 1 for special designating plates received a Purple Heart in connection with that disability, as evidenced by certification from the United States Veterans Administration or any branch of the United States Armed Forces, that disabled veteran may receive special designating plates, designed by the Secretary of State, that indicate that the vehicle is owned by a Purple Heart recipient.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill expands the provision on special license plates 40 for disabled veterans to include a special designating plate 42 indicating that the veteran is a recipient of the Purple Heart.
