### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

Resolve, to Establish the Special Commission to Study the Operations of State Government.

(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, State Government is facing a projected revenue shortfall for the balance of this fiscal year and may face a shortfall in the next biennium; and

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Whereas, substantial opportunities for cost savings in State Government need to be identified immediately; and

Whereas, in order to submit an interim report by April 1st and a final report in time for the next legislative session, a study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

- Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Special Commission to Study the Operations of State Government is established; and be it further
- Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 13 members: 9 persons in managerial positions in private enterprises, 7 of whom are appointed by the Governor, one by the President of the Senate and one by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 2 persons who are or have been college or university educators and are not teaching in state-funded institutions, one of whom is appointed by the Governor and one by the President of the Senate; and 2 persons who are health care administrators, one of whom is appointed by the Governor and one by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and be it further
- 3. Appointments: meetings. Resolved: That appointments must be made no later than 10 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. appointment of a majority of the members has been completed, the Governor shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than February 1, 1991. The Governor shall select a chair from among the commission members; and be it further

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Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study all operations of State Government with a view toward

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill establishes the Special Commission to Study the Operations of State Government and instructs the commission to study and make recommendations to streamline operations of State Government to achieve immediate and long-term cost savings. The commission shall report its interim findings to the Legislature by April 1, 1991 and submit a final report to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature, together with any implementing legislation, by November 1, 1991.

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
