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#### CHAPTER 149-A

#### STATE REVENUE FORECASTING COMMISSION

## §1675. State Revenue Forecasting Commission established

The State Revenue Forecasting Commission, known in this chapter as the "commission," is established pursuant to section 12004-G, subsection 35, for the purpose of providing the Governor and the Legislature with supplemental projections and analyses of revenues for the General Fund and General Highway Fund. Revenue findings and recommendations for other funds may be provided to the Governor and the Legislature at the discretion of the commission. The commission consists of 4 members appointed in January of every odd-numbered year as follows: two members appointed by the Governor; one member appointed by the President of the Senate; and one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. A chair must be selected annually from among the 4 members. No one may be appointed who is a Legislator at the time of appointment. Each member must have a demonstrated expertise in revenue forecasting and economic and fiscal issues.

All members must be appointed for terms to coincide with the legislative biennium. Vacancies must be filled in the same manner as the original appointments for the balance of the unexpired terms.

The members are entitled to compensation as authorized by chapter 379.

#### \$1676. Duties of commission

The commission shall develop state revenue projections for the next fiscal biennium and analyze revenue projections for the current fiscal biennium.

1. Biennial revenue projections. No later than October 15th of each even-numbered year, the commission shall submit to the Governor, the Legislative Council, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over

- appropriations and financial affairs and the State Budget Officer 2 a report that presents the commission's findings and recommendations for General Fund and General Highway Fund revenue projections for the next fiscal biennium. In its report the 4 commission shall fully describe the methodology employed in reaching its recommendations. Revenue projections for other б funds of the State may be included at the discretion of the commission. 8
- 10 2. Current biennium adjustments. No later than March 15th. June 15th, September 15th and December 15th of each year the 12 commission shall submit to the Governor, the Legislative Council, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs and the 14 State Budget Officer a report that presents the commission's 16 findings and recommendations for adjustments of General Fund revenue and General Highway Fund revenue projections for the 18 current fiscal biennium. In each quarterly report the commission shall fully describe the methodology employed in reaching its recommendations. Revenue findings and recommendations for other 20 funds of the State may be included at the discretion of the commission. 22

#### \$1677. Contracts

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26 The commission may enter into contractual arrangements for the procurement of economic and forecasting models, data and assistance in analyzing that data. 28

#### \$1678. Meetings

32 The commission shall meet at least 4 times a year. Additional meetings may be called by the chair or by any 2 members. All meetings must be open to the public. 34

## §1679. Staffing

38 The commission may receive staff support from the Bureau of the Budget and the Office of Fiscal and Program Review. Clerical assistance must be shared jointly among these offices. 40

### COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A" to S.P. 232, L.D. 586

This amendment replaces the original bill with a "consensus revenue estimating commission." A number of states have implemented this approach as a means of stabilizing the budgeting process at the state level.
