Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the legislative branch and the executive branch are in need of regular, objective projections of state revenue; and

Whereas, such projections are needed to ensure coordinated public policy decisions and informed decisions on spending choices; and

Whereas, this legislation provides the Legislature with the capability to project revenues in the future and to provide input into revenue projections for fiscal year 1990-91 and for the 1992-93 biennium; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Sec. 1. 3 MRSA §163-A, sub-§10-A is enacted to read:

### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

10-A. Revenue projections. To develop state revenue projections for the next fiscal biennium and to analyze revenue projections for the current fiscal biennium. The revenue projections and analyses must be provided to the Legislative Council, the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over appropriations and financial affairs and the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over taxation. The revenue projections and analyses must be provided to other joint standing or joint select committees of

#### Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §§1663-A and 1666-A are enacted to read:

#### §1663-A. Access to information

the Legislature upon request;

In order to assist the legislative staff in meeting its responsibilities under Title 3, section 163-A, the Department of Finance shall cooperate with the office designated by the Legislative Council as having responsibility for expenditure and revenue analyses in terms of providing information and data. Legislative staff is bound by the confidentiality restrictions concerning certain tax records as described in Title 36, chapter 7.
