An Act to Prohibit the Breaking of Glass Products in Games of Skill.



	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 17 MRSA §331, sub-§9 is enacted to read:
4	poor 1. It italists good, band 3.5. Ib character to lead.
	9. Glass; prohibited. The use of glass is prohibited in
6	games of skill pursuant to Title 32, section 1873.
8	Sec. 2. 32 MRSA §1873 is enacted to read:
10	§1873. Glass-breaking games
12	A person, firm, corporation, association or organization may
14	not hold, conduct or operate games of skill, as defined in Title 17, section 330, subsection 2-A, that involve the breaking of
14	glass. A violation of this section is a Class D crime.

18	STATEMENT OF FACT
20	This bill eliminates the destruction of glass bottles that are used as targets in games of skill in an effort to encourage
22	the reuse or recycling of the glass bottles. This bill prohibits games of skill that involve the breaking of glass. Anyone who
24	violates this provision is guilty of a Class D crime under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32, section 1873.
