16 18	STATEMENT OF FACT
20	This amendment removes 13 sections from the bill and adds 6 technical corrections to the laws of Maine.
22	Section B-1 corrects conflicts caused by 2 public laws enacted last year and 2 public laws enacted this year.
24	
26	Section B-2 repeals and replaces a section of the Maine Revised Statutes. The provision was written in an improper format; the new provision is in proper format. The Legislature
28	does not intend to affect the terms of current members of the Travel Information Advisory Council by repealing and replacing
30	the subsection to correct the format.
32	Section B-3 amends the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 24-A, section 222, subsection 9. The section addresses holding
34	companies and insurance. The last paragraph in subsection 9, covering failure to comply with the subsection, applies to the
36	entire subsection, but it is formatted to appear to apply only to paragraph C. This section of the Errors Bill reformats the last
8 8	paragraph to apply to the entire subsection.
10	Section B-4 corrects the title of a subchapter to reflect
12	subsequent changes in the subchapter. Sections C-1 and C-2 make 2 corrections to the most recently
14	enacted changes to the charter of the Northern Maine Regional Planning Commission. First, the history line is corrected to
16	refer to an amendment made in 1990. Second, a reference to Title
18	13-B, governing nonprofit corporations, is changed to refer to the general corporations statute, Title 13. Title 13-B does not
50	apply to regional planning commissions, even though they are nonprofit.
