COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 176, L.D. 228, "RESOLUTION,  
Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Protect  
State Parks"

Amend the resolution by striking out that part designated  
section 23 (page 1, lines 7 to 9 in L.D.) and inserting in its  
place the following:

'Sec. 23. State park land protected. The fee title to land  
acquired and held for state park or historic site purposes may be  
sold only if the proceeds of the sale are used to acquire other  
state park or historic site land.'

Further amend the resolution by striking the referendum  
question (page 1, lines 24 and 25 in L.D.) and inserting in its  
place the following:

"Do you favor amending the Constitution of Maine to  
prohibit the sale of state park or historic site land unless  
the proceeds are used to acquire other state park or  
historic site land?"

Further amend the resolution by inserting at the end before  
the statement of fact the following:

FISCAL NOTE

The estimated cost of sending this constitutional resolution  
out to referendum will vary according to the total number of  
referenda enacted during the First Regular Session of the 116th  
Legislature. The estimated cost to the Secretary of State if one  
to 6 referenda are enacted is \$95,000. Each additional  
referendum costs an additional \$7,000.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment changes the language of the proposed amendment to the Maine Constitution to permit the sale of state park or historic site land only when the proceeds of the sale are used to acquire other state park or historic site land.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
