HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 92, L.D. 246, Bill, "An Act to 14 Prevent Discrimination"

Amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'Sec. 6. Statutory referendum procedure; submission at statewide
election; form of question; effective date. This Act must be submitted to the legal voters of the State of Maine at a statewide election
to be held on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following passage of this Act. The municipal officers of this
State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law
for holding a statewide election, to vote on the acceptance or rejection of this Act by voting on the following question:

"Do you favor amending the Maine Human Rights Act to provide a protected class for sexual orientation?"

32 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice 34 by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, 36 sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same 38 manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the Act, the Governor shall 40 proclaim that fact without delay, and the Act takes effect 30 42 days after the date of the proclamation.

HOUSE AMENDMENT

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 92, L.D. 246

The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this Act necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.

## FISCAL NOTE

The estimated cost of sending this bill out to referendum will vary according to the total number of referenda enacted during the First Regular Session of the 116th Legislature. The estimated cost to the Secretary of State if one to 6 referenda are enacted is \$95,000. Each additional referendum costs an 14 additional \$7,000.

16 If the referendum is approved by the voters, the Maine Human Rights Commission would incur some minor additional costs to 18 investigate complaints involving discrimination due to sexual orientation. These costs could be absorbed within the 20 commission's existing budgeted resources.

22 The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system 24 could be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

30 This amendment adds a referendum and a fiscal note to the bill.
