Whereas, the laws restricting the use or administration of biosynthetic bovine somatotropin, known as BST, will be repealed on February 1, 1993; and

Whereas, the repeal on restrictions involving the use or administration of BST needs to be extended until more extensive human and animal safety studies are completed; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, Ę.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 7 MRSA 3105, last ¶, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 725, 22 §4, is amended to read:

24 This section is repealed February 1, 1993 1994.

26 Sec. 2. Retroactivity. This Act takes effect retroactively to February 1, 1993.

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Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the 30 preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill extends the sunset provision regarding the laws 36 that restrict the use and administration of biosynthetic bovine somatotropin, known as BST, from February 1, 1993 to February 1, 38 1994.

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
