The distribution of General Purpose Aid for Local Schools for fiscal year 1992-93, as established in Public Law 1991, chapter 802, provided that the state subsidy for fiscal year 1992-93 be the same as that for fiscal year 1991-92 and did not specify school bus purchase reimbursements as an exception. This bill provides the necessary appropriation to reimburse school units the appropriate state share for school buses purchased in fiscal year 1991-92 net of any reimbursements received from prior year school bus purchases.
