

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 §44, is further amended to read:

6 3. **Interstate commerce corporation employees.** An officer
7 or employee of a corporation engaged in interstate commerce as
8 defined in the Act of Congress entitled "An Act to Regulate
9 Commerce" approved February 4, 1887, as amended, or in interstate
10 communication as defined in the Act of Congress entitled
11 "Communications Act of 1934" approved June 9, 1934, while working
12 solely as an employee of that corporation, provided an officer or
13 employee of that corporation customarily in responsible charge of
14 the surveying work of that corporation within this State is
15 licensed under this chapter; -ex
