	Programs, established in section 12004-I, subsection 25-B and

	2. Selection. The Commissioner of Finance and
	Administration, the State Auditor and the Director of the Office
	of Fiscal and Program Review shall each select one member of the
	board. Members serve 2-year terms coinciding with the state
	budgetary cycle; vacancies are filled for the remainder of the
	cycle. Members may be appointed to no more than 3 consecutive full terms.

	3. Duties. The board shall meet as often as necessary to
į	perform its duties. The responsibility of the board is to
	biennially conduct an independent audit of the cost and operation
	of the federal programs listed in this subsection. The purpose
	of the audit is to identify cost-saving and service-provision
	options related to state operation of or participation in each program. The board shall submit the results of its audit,
	including state funding level options, to the Governor and the
	Legislative Council by November 1st of each even-numbered year.
	The board must be available to advise the Governor and the
	Legislature at any time on budgetary matters related to the
	federal programs listed in this subsection.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill establishes the Budget Advisory Board on Federal Programs, consisting of 3 part-time members experienced in finance, accounting or budgetary matters. The purpose of the board is to analyze the State's responsibilities and options under certain federal programs and to identify cost-saving or service-provision options. The board is to report to the Governor and the Legislature every 2 years to coincide with the development of the biennial state budget. The board is to be available to advise the Governor and the Legislature at other times.
