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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "代" to S.P. 234, L.D. 727, Bill, "An Act to Require Postgraduate Residency Training for Podiatric Medical Licensure and to Permit Temporary Residency Licensure"

Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "<u>\$3651-A.</u>" in subsection 1 in the first line (page 1, line 7 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "<u>applicant</u>" the following: '<u>who has graduated after January 1, 1991 from</u> <u>podiatric medical school as set forth in section 3651</u>'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated 24 "<u>\$3651-A.</u>" in subsection 1 in the 2nd line (page 1, line 8 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "<u>after July 1, 1995</u>" 26

Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated " $\S3651-A$." in subsection 2 in the first line (page 1, line 14 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "<u>After July 1, 1995, a</u>" and inserting in its place the following: '<u>A</u>'

Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated "<u>§3651-A.</u>" in subsection 2 in the first and 2nd lines (page 1, lines 14 and 15 in L.D.) by inserting after the following: "<u>of podiatric medicine</u>" the following: '<u>who has graduated after January 1, 1991 from podiatric medical school as set forth in section 3651'</u>

Further amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated 40 "<u>\$3651-A.</u>" in subsection 2 in paragraph A in the 3rd line (page 1, line 21 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "<u>section</u>" and 42 inserting in its place the following: '<u>chapter</u>'

44 Further amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated
"§3654." in the first paragraph in the 4th to 6th lines from the
46 end (page 2, lines 7 to 9 in L.D.) by striking out the

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following: "<u>, from July 1, 1995 to June 30, 2000, the podiatrist has fewer than 5 years' experience in the practice of podiatry, the podiatrist must have</u>" and inserting in its place the following: '<u>a podiatrist who has graduated after January 1, 1991 from podiatric medical school as set forth in section 3651 has</u>'

Further amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated "§3654." in the first paragraph in the 3rd line from the end (page 2, line 10 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "<u>3651</u>" and inserting in its place the following: '<u>3651-A</u>'

12 Further amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated "§3654." in the first paragraph by striking out all of the last 14 sentence (page 2, lines 10 to 12 in L.D.)

Further amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated 16 "\$3654." in the 2nd paragraph in the 8th and 9th lines (page 2, lines 21 and 22 in L.D.) by striking out the following: 18 "<u>From</u> July 1, 1995 to June 30, 2000, an" and inserting in its place the 20 following: 'An' and in the 10th to 13th lines (page 2, lines 23 "<u>has at least 5</u> to 26 in L.D.) by striking out the following: 22 years' experience in the practice of podiatry is not required to have completed a residency program in podiatric medicine. After June 30, 2000, an applicant for licensure by endorsement" and 24 inserting in its place the following: 'graduated after January 1, 1991 from podiatric medical school as set forth in section 26 3651'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 30 statement of fact the following:

'Sec. 3. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue funds to carry out the purposes of this Act.

36	The bill requires an applicant for a podiatrist's license after July 1, 1995 to have completed a one-year residency. This amendment makes this a requirement of anyone applying for a license who graduated from podiatric medical school after January 1, 1991.		
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42	Further, the bill requires a lice	-	
44	another state applying for a Maine license and June 30, 2000 by reciprocity or endor	sement to ha	ve had a
46	one-year residency if that person has fewer than 5 years' experience. After that time, all applicants for a reciprocity license must have a one-year residency.

50	The amendment requires those persons w podiatric medical school after January 1		
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residency requirement in order to obtain a license by reciprocity or endorsement.

The amendment also adds an allocation and fiscal note to the bill.
