SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 666, L.D. 904, Bill, "An Act to Protect Maine Citizens From the Effects of Environmental Tobacco Smoke"

Amend the bill in section 1 by striking out all of that part designated "<u>§1543.</u>" and inserting in its place the following:

20 '<u>§1543. Posting signs</u>

1. Designating smoking and nonsmoking areas. Signs must be posted conspicuously in buildings where smoking is regulated by this chapter. Designated areas must have signs that read "Smoking Permitted" with letters at least one inch in height.
Places where smoking is prohibited must have signs that read "No Smoking" with letters at least one inch in height or the international symbol for no smoking.

2. Smoking policy. The owner or leasee of a building where smoking is regulated by this chapter must post conspicuously signs that are clearly visible from outside of the building, stating the smoking policy for that building.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

FISCAL NOTE

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44 46 The additional workload and administrative costs associated with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system can be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial Department. The collection of additional fines may increase General Fund revenues by a minor amount.'
