Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 21-A MRSA §682, sub-§2, as enacted by PL 1985, c. 161, §6, is amended to read:

Influence prohibited. Within the voting place, no a 2. person may not influence or attempt to influence another person's choice of candidates. This limitation does not prohibit a candidate from attending the voting and place erally communicating-with-voters voting, as long as he the candidate does not attempt to influence their-vete the votes of others. A candidate may not orally communicate with voters within 250 feet of the entrance to either the voting place or the registrar's office.

This bill prohibits candidates from orally communicating with voters within 250 feet of the voting place or the registrar's office. The bill does not prohibit a candidate from attending the voting place in order to cast the candidate's vote.
