## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maime as follows:

Sec. $\mathbb{1} . \mathbb{P} \& S L \mathbb{1 9 9 1}, \mathbb{C} \mathbb{1 0 0}, \mathbb{P} t . \mathbb{A}, \S \mathbb{1}, 3$ rd $\mathbb{T}$ is amended to read:
A third line, beginning at the existing definition of the Town of Falmouth, the Town of Cumberland and the City of Portland common meeting point at approximately $43^{\circ} 43^{\prime} 27^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{N}$ and $70^{\circ} 10^{\prime}$ $12^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{W}$ extends as a line $124^{\circ}$ southeast to a point halfway between where the existing Town of Cumberland boundary intersects mean high water on the northwest and southeast shorelines, respectively, of Hope Island, Cumberland; at that point a fourth line extending approximately $204^{\circ}$ southwest to $43^{\circ} 41^{\prime} 00^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{N}$ and $70^{\circ} 08^{\prime} 00^{\prime \prime} W$ and then from that point a line extending approximately $142^{\circ}$ southeast to a point southwest of Cliff Island
 W.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

During the arbitration hearing on the separation of the Town of Long Island from the City of Portland, the panel's chair, Chief Justice Vincent L. McKusick, noted that the description of the town in the original legislation is incomplete. Other reviewers have also noted the error. This bill corrects the description.
