An Act to Correct the Boundary Description of the Town of Long Island.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. P&SL 1991, c. 100, Pt. A, §1, 3rd ¶ is amended to read:

A third line, beginning at the existing definition of the Town of Falmouth, the Town of Cumberland and the City of Portland common meeting point at approximately 43° 43' 27" N and 70° 10' 12" W extends as a line 124° southeast to a point halfway between where the existing Town of Cumberland boundary intersects mean high water on the northwest and southeast shorelines, respectively, of Hope Island, Cumberland; at that point a fourth line extending approximately 204° southwest to 43° 41' 00" N and 70° 08' 00" W and then from that point a line extending approximately 142° southeast to a point southwest of Cliff Island at 43°-41'-00"-N and 70° 08'-00"-W 43° 40' 30" N and 70° 07' 30" <u>W</u>.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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During the arbitration hearing on the separation of the Town of Long Island from the City of Portland, the panel's chair, Chief Justice Vincent L. McKusick, noted that the description of the town in the original legislation is incomplete. Other reviewers have also noted the error. This bill corrects the description.

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
