## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maime as follows:

Sec. 1. $20-\mathrm{A}$ MRSA §6004, sub-§2, $\mathbb{T 1 T}$ and $\mathbb{E}$ are enacted to read:
D. A student with limited English proficiency must be counted as 1.2 students for purposes of this section. "Limited English proficiency" has the meaning set forth in the Bilingual Education Act, 20 United States Code, Section 3283 (a) (1) (1988).
E. A student who is eligible to receive a free or reduced-price meal under the federal school lunch program must be counted as 1.2 students for purposes of this section.

Sec. 2. $20=\mathbb{A} \mathbb{M} \mathbb{R} \mathbb{A} \S 156 \mathbb{1} 2$, subb-§ $\mathbb{1} 2$, as amended by PL 1989, c. 875, Pt. E, §31, is repealed.

Sec. 3. $20-\mathbb{A} \mathbb{M} R A \mathbb{1} \$ 612$, subb- $£ 13$, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 875, Pt. E, §32, is amended to read:
13. Adjustment limitations: The amounts of the adjustments paid to school administrative units or municipalities in subsections $1,2,4,6,7,10$ and 11 and- 72 are limited to the amounts appropriated by the Legislature for these adjustments.

## STATERIENT OF FACT

This bill provides for weighted pupil counts for students with limited English proficiency and economically disadvantaged students. The bill adjusts the foundation funding formula operating costs allocation by recognizing the additional costs associated with educating those students. The bill repeals a current provision that allows for limited low-income student adjustment to certain school administrative units.
