SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 401, L.D. 1232, Bill, "An Act  
Regarding Reciprocity of Licensing Barbers and Cosmetologists"

Amend the bill in section 1 in that part designated  
"\$14231." in the first paragraph in the 2nd and 3rd lines (page  
1, lines 9 and 10 in L.D.) by striking out the following:  
"current licensure in" and inserting in its place the following:  
'~~current-licensure-in~~ being authorized to practice by'

STATEMENT OF FACT

Currently, Maine may grant a barber or cosmetologist license  
to any person licensed in a state that has similar licensing  
standards and grants licenses to Maine licensed practitioners.  
The bill requires that Maine grant a license to a licensed  
practitioner from another jurisdiction whose standards are as  
high or higher than those in Maine regardless of whether that  
jurisdiction grants licenses to Maine licensees.

This amendment states that the reciprocity is to be extended  
to anyone who is authorized to practice in another state but it  
continues the provision that the standards of the other state  
must be as high as those in Maine.
