Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §1304-B, sub-§8 is enacted to read:

8. Criminal penalty. A person commits solid waste
diversion if the person intentionally, knowingly or recklessly
diverts, transports or conveys solid waste to a disposal facility
that is not authorized to accept that solid waste pursuant to
state laws, municipal ordinance or other rule. Solid waste
diversion is a Class D crime.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to prevent trash haulers in a particular region from going to unauthorized disposal facilities in order to profit by lower tipping fees. This bill creates the crime of "solid waste diversion." This bill authorizes enforcement of municipal ordinances mandating the disposal of solid waste at specific energy generating facilities.

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
