22	Amend the bill by striking out everything after the title and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the

26	'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted							
28	as emergencies; and							
30	Whereas, commercial diving is an inherently dangerous activity; and							
32	Whereas, 4 fatalities occurred in the State in 1993 directly							
34	related to the commercial harvesting of marine organisms; and							
36	Whereas, existing marine resource laws do not require that							
38	divers engaged in the commercial harvesting of marine organisms obtain any underwater safety training prior to obtaining a							
40	license for commercial handharvesting of marine organisms; and							
40	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts							
42	create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately							
44	necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

commissioner has until August 15, 1994 to establish a curriculum

for certifying the competency of commercial handharvesters.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "\" to H.P. 973, L.D. 1304

amendment allows the commissioner to waive components of the competency course based on demonstrated expertise or experience.

- The amendment also requires persons seeking to obtain a sea urchin boat tender license to attend a boat tender training session. The boat tender training session will focus on risk factors associated with diving and will include basic CPR training.
- The amendment also adds an emergency preamble, an emergency clause, an allocation section and a fiscal note to the bill.
