Further amend the bill in section 8 in that part designated "§14308." in subsection 3 in the first paragraph in the 5th line from the end (page 5, line 6 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "registered therapist or certified practitioner," and inserting in its place the following: 'registered practitioner or certified therapist,'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

Broadening the definition of massage therapist, certain changes in registration procedures and requirements and the granting of reciprocity will result in insignificant increases of dedicated revenues to the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation from registration fees.

The Department of Professional and Financial Regulation will incur some minor additional costs to adopt rules relating to massage therapists. These costs can be absorbed within the department's existing budgeted resources.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

Current law requires that persons be registered with the State in order to call themselves massage therapists. Although there is some confusion, the bill appears to require that persons must be registered in order to call themselves registered massage practitioners and must meet certain qualifications in order to call themselves certified massage therapists. This amendment requires that persons be registered in order to call themselves massage practitioners and meet certain qualifications in order to be certified and to call themselves massage therapists.

The bill requires that to be certified a person must pass an examination or have graduated from a school accredited by the American Massage Therapy Association. This amendment requires that schools be accredited by the Commission on Massage Training Accreditation/Approval, but until January 1, 1995 continues to

accept those schools accredited by the Massage Therapy
2 Association and accepts membership in that association as a 3rd
means, after the examination and schooling, of fulfilling the
4 knowledge requirement for certification.
