An Act to Change Beneficiary Provisions for Survivor Benefits in the Maine State Retirement System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

- Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17054, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1991, c. 746, §7 and affected by §10, is further amended to read:
- Recovery of overpayments by the retirement system. amounts due the retirement system as the result of overpayment of benefits or an excess refund of contributions may be recovered from an individual's contributions or any benefits payable under this Part to the individual or the beneficiary of individual. If the overpayment or excess refund of contributions resulted from an unintentional mistake by an employee of the retirement system, the retiree or the recipient of the benefit, no interest may be collected by the retirement system on the amount to be recovered. The executive director may also take action to recover those amounts due from any amounts payable to the individual by any other state agency or by an action in a court of competent jurisdiction. Whenever the executive director makes a decision to recover any amounts under this subsection, that decision is subject to appeal under section 17451; and
- Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §17054, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 746, §8 and affected by §10, is amended to read:
- 4. Qualified domestic relations order. The rights of a member or retiree under this Part are subject to the rights of or assignment to an alternate payee under a qualified domestic relations order in accordance with section 17059. ; and

Sec. 3. 5 MRSA §17054, sub-§5 is enacted to read:

5. Transfer of rights by original beneficiary. An original beneficiary named by the member may elect to name another person as beneficiary in place of the original beneficiary, removing all rights of surviving benefits of the first beneficiary and transferring these rights to another person. The surviving benefits calculated based on the original beneficiary do not change and are payable to the new beneficiary until the benefits would have expired under the original beneficiary's rights. This subsection applies only to survivor benefits and to no other part of the system.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill allows for the transfer of rights of a surviving beneficiary to another person, only once and only by the original beneficiary. Currently, the law does not allow the assignment of benefits by the beneficiary, other than an election not to

receive benefits, in which case the benefits would be divided among the remaining beneficiaries or others as dictated by the law. This bill does not apply to life insurance or any other type of benefits allowed under the Maine State Retirement System.
