2	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §642, sub-§§4-B, 4-C, 8 and 9 are enacted to read:
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	4-B. Reductions in service. An award may not be approved
6	by the board that generates savings through a reduction of
8	services, unless it is an identified duplication of services.
	4-C. Maximum cash award for fiscal years 1993-94 and
10	1994-95. For the fiscal years ending June 30, 1994 and June 30,
	1995 the maximum cash award approved is limited to 10% of the
12	first year's estimated savings, or \$25,000, whichever is less.
	Except as provided in subsection 4-A, an award may not be made
14	for any suggested savings of less than \$250. Any cash awards
	approved by the board must be charged against the fund or funds
16	to which estimated savings apply. If it is not possible to
	reasonably estimate the savings, the board may pay an initial
18	amount and pay an additional amount at the end of the first year,
	or may pay the full amount at the end of the first year.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill increases the incentive for state employees to come forward with savings and also provides state departments and agencies with incentives to save funds by allowing the departments and agencies to retain 30% of the first year's estimated savings. Departments and agencies will be able to keep these funds in dedicated accounts for their own use.

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
