SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P.
1099, L.D. 1486, Bill, "An Act to Consolidate All Substance Abuse
Programs within the Office of Substance Abuse"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 17 (page
3, lines 26 to 33 in amendment) and inserting in its place the
following:

'Sec. 17. Transition. Employees of the Division of Alcohol
and Drug Educational Services within the Department of Education
whose positions are transferred to the Office of Substance Abuse
under this Act retain their positions within the Office of
Substance Abuse, along with all of their employee rights,
privileges and benefits, including sick leave and vacation. All
personnel transferred to the Office of Substance Abuse retain all
applicable seniority rights and privileges with regard to
employment in the Department of Education for a period of 2 years
from the effective date of this Act. The Bureau of Human
Resources within the Department of Administrative and Financial
Services shall assist with the orderly implementation of this
section.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment clarifies the rights, benefits and privileges
that are retained by employees transferred to the Office of
Substance Abuse.
