Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

Whereas, certain payroll obligations for fiscal year 1994-95 will begin to accrue prior to July 1, 1994; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

Provides for a line category transfer including funds for 3 Mental Health and Mental Retardation Casework Supervisor positions and 15 Psychiatric Social Worker II positions to maintain state-staffed crisis programs.

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides for a General Fund line category transfer within the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation including funds for 18 positions to maintain state-staffed mental health crisis programs in fiscal year 1994-95.
