Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2 Sec. 1. PL 1993, c. 410, Pt. LL, §14 is amended to read:

4 Sec. LL-14. Consolidation of substance abuse services programs.
6 All substance abuse services and programs currently in existence
8 throughout State Government, including but not limited to
10 programs implemented by the Department of Education, the
12 Department of Corrections and, the Department of Mental Health
14 and Mental Retardation, the Department of Public Safety and the
Maine National Guard, are consolidated within the Office of
Substance Abuse in accordance with the plan required in section
15.

16 Sec. 2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated
18 from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

38 This bill adds the Department of Public Safety and the Maine
40 National Guard to the list of agencies and departments that are
42 to be consolidated with the Office of Substance Abuse as part of
44 the consolidation plan to administer substance abuse service
programs. The bill provides that positions and substance abuse
services from the Department of Education and the Department of
Corrections be consolidated with the Office of Substance Abuse as
part of the consolidation plan.
