Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and

8 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses will become due and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1994; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

PART A

Sec. A-1. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from the Highway Fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1995 to carry out the purposes of this Part.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill does the following.

Part A makes supplemental allocations from the Highway Fund.

Part B makes allocations from the Highway Fund for approved reclassifications and range changes.

14 Part C amends Public Law 1993, chapter 414, Part B.

16 The bill also allows the State Police account in the Department of Public Safety to carry unencumbered Personal
18 Services balances to June 30, 1995 to conduct a Maine State Police training academy.

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
