SENATE AMENDMENT "D" to S.P. 96, "Joint Order to Implement
Changes from the Joint Select Committee on Rules"

Amend the Joint Order in the Joint Rules by inserting after
12-C the following:

'12-D. Legislative Term Limitations. Beginning with the
116th Legislature, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of
the House of Representatives and the majority leader, the
assistant majority leader, the minority leader and the assistant
minority leader of each house may not serve more than 3
consecutive terms.'

Further amend the Joint Order to renumber any duplicate Rule
numbers to read alphanumerically.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment limits to 3 the number of consecutive terms
that a member of the Legislature may serve in a particular
leadership position.
