30	The estimated cost of sending this Constitutional Amendment out to referendum will vary according to the total number of referenda enacted during the First Regular Session of the 117th
32	Legislature. The estimated cost to the Secretary of State if one to 6 referenda are enacted is \$95,000. Each additional
34	referendum costs an additional \$7,000.
36	If approved by the voters, the Legislature would realize net General Fund savings beginning in fiscal year 1996-97. These
38	savings, resulting from reductions of Legislators' salaries and benefits, travel and constituent allowances and legislative
40	staff, would be approximately \$970,000 for a first regular session and \$670,000 for a second regular session.
