

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §8304-B** is enacted to read:

6 **§8304-B. Proof of rabies vaccination**

8 A license or certificate of registration or the renewal of a
10 license or certificate of registration as provided by this
12 chapter may not be issued until the department is furnished with
a copy of a rabies vaccination for any dog or cat residing
permanently or occasionally on the premises of the day care or
home baby-sitting service.

22 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

24 This bill requires that day care facilities for children and
26 home baby-sitting services must provide proof of rabies
vaccination for any dog or cat residing permanently or
occasionally on its premises.
