4	<pre>Sec. 1. 20-A MRSA §1001, sub-§14, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 423, §1, is amended to read:</pre>
6 8	A. The requirement of competitive bidding may be waived by a school board when:
)	(1) In the opinion of the school board, an emergency exists that requires the immediate procurement of
!	insurance. The emergency may include the premature cancellation of an existing policy or acquisition of a risk that can not be added to an existing policy,
:	including the signing of a lease. However, at the next renewal of the policy, procurement of insurance is subject to competitive bidding;
	(2) After reasonable investigation by the school board, it appears that the required insurance is
	procurable from only one source;
	(3) It appears to be in the best interest of the school board to negotiate for the procurement of an
:	excess insurance line;
	(4) The line of insurance is workers' compensation or an employee benefit such as life, disability or health insurance in accordance with subsection 5; ex
	(5) The school board is in a municipal school unit and
	school insurance and municipal insurance are purchased as a package through competitive bidding by the municipal government. : or
	(6) The risk pool, of which the school unit is a member, complies with the provisions of this competitive bidding process for the risk pool as a
;	whole.

2	STATEMENT OF FACT
4	This bill adds a voluntary exemption from the required competitive bidding for insurance for individual school units by

allowing the risk pool to competitively bid for its members.
