7. Implementation date. The department shall implement the
program 90 days from the date on which the United States
Department of Health and Human Services grants a waiver for the
Learnfare Program.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The bill directs the Department of Human Services to pursue 14 a federal waiver to establish a Learnfare Program. Under the Learnfare Program parents under the age of 24 who are heads of 16 households and children in households receiving aid to families with dependent children who have not completed high school must attend school regularly. Case management services are provided. 18 Benefits are suspended for failure to comply with the program 20 The department is required to implement the requirements. program 90 days after the granting of the waiver by the United 22 States Department of Health and Human Services.
