§27. Requirements

The department is required to implement the electronic benefit delivery program to ensure that implementation of the program does not result in undue hardship or any decrease in benefits for recipients and to ensure that the costs of the electronic benefit delivery program are not charged to the recipients.

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§28. Implementation date

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The department shall implement the electronic benefit delivery system within 90 days from the date on which the United States Department of Health and Human Services grants a waiver for the electronic benefit delivery program.

§29. Report

By January 1, 1996, the department shall report to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over human resource matters on progress in implementing the electronic benefit delivery program.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill establishes an electronic benefit delivery program for the delivery of benefits by automated means to recipients of the Aid to Families with Dependent Children, food stamp, Medicaid and the Women, Infants and Children Special Supplemental Food programs. This bill enables program recipients to use encoded cards to withdraw benefits from automated teller and point of service machines on a periodic basis.

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The bill requires the Department of Human Services to apply for a waiver to establish the electronic benefit delivery program and requires that program to be implemented within 90 days of receipt of the waiver.

The bill requires a report by January 1, 1996, by the Department of Human Services to the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources on progress in implementing the program.
