'FISCAL NOTE

Establishing new nonresident snowmobile registration fees for owners and dealers will increase annual General Fund revenue. Depending on the types of registrations actually sold, the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife may collect as much as \$123,495 in additional annual fees for deposit into the General Fund. The amounts can not be determined at this time.

The increase in General Fund revenues collected by the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife may require additional General Fund appropriations to the department pursuant to the Constitution of Maine. The amounts will depend on the total General Fund appropriations to the department and the revenue generated by the department, which will be determined by final legislative actions on the current services budget and other legislation during the First Regular Session of the 117th Legislature.

Establishing new nonresident snowmobile registration fees for owners and dealers will also increase dedicated revenue collected for the Snowmobile Trail Fund within the Department of Conservation. Depending on the types of registrations actually sold, the Department of Conservation could receive as much as \$205,825 in additional annual fees for deposit into the Snowmobile Trail Fund. The amounts can not be determined at this time.'

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment replaces the bill and adds an emergency preamble and an emergency clause.

Beginning on July 1, 1995, this amendment increases the fee for nonresident snowmobile registration and exempts nonresidents from sales and use taxes on snowmobiles. Requirements that snowmobile registration agents collect and send forms proving exemption from sales and use taxes to the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife are repealed. Increased revenues from the higher nonresident registration fee are dedicated to the Snowmobile Trail Fund within the Department of Conservation.

This amendment creates a 3-day nonresident snowmobile registration for \$35, a 10-day nonresident snowmobile registration for \$50 and a seasonal nonresident snowmobile registration for \$60. The amendment makes it easier for nonresidents to register snowmobiles by requiring that the commissioner use the same criteria to select nonresident snowmobile registration agents as are used to select nonresident fishing license agents.

The amendment also increases that portion of the nonresident snowmobile registration fee that is credited to the General Fund from \$10.75 per registration to \$15 per registration.

The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.

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
