SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 418, L.D. 568, Bill, "An Act to Implement the Recommendations of the Commission to Study Poverty Among Working Parents with Regard to Raising the Minimum Wage"

Amend the amendment by striking out all of section 2 (page 1, lines 38 to 50 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following:

Sec. 2. Posting of notice. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 701, the Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Standards is not required to modify and redistribute the printed notice required by that section to reflect the changes in the law resulting from this Act. The Bureau of Labor Standards shall modify the printed notice to reflect the changes contained in this Act when it becomes necessary to print additional notices due to an insufficient supply of such notices or future changes in the laws.'

as a result of changes in the minimum wage law, this amendment
eliminates the General Fund cost of \$11,259 in fiscal year
1998-99.

SUMMARY

This amendment removes the appropriation section from the
committee amendment. This amendment removes the fiscal impact of
the committee amendment by removing the requirement in current
law that the Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Standards
furnish to employers printed notices that state certain labor
laws until the bureau runs out of the forms or there are future
changes to the state labor laws.
