COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 442, L.D. 592, Bill, "An Act to Amend the Laws Regulating the Installation and Inspection of Septic Systems"

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the summary and inserting in its place the following:

Sec. 1. 30-A MRSA §4211, sub-§5, ¶D, as enacted by PL 1993, c. 611, §1, is amended to read:

D. A nonengineered subsurface waste water disposal system fee not to exceed \$60 \$100 may be charged.

Sec. 2. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue to carry out the purposes of this Act.

Allocates funds due to an increase in the nonengineered subsurface waste water disposal system fee.'

Increasing the maximum fee that may be charged will result in an increase in Other Special Revenue to the Department of Human Services estimated to be \$45,000 and \$60,000 in fiscal years 1997-98 and 1998-99, respectively. This amendment allocates those additional funds to the Control Over Plumbing program.'

**SUMMARY**

This amendment replaces the bill. The amendment increases the maximum fee that may be charged for a nonengineered subsurface waste water disposal system permit from \$60 to \$100. The amendment also adds an allocation and a fiscal note to the bill.
