The additional sales tax exemption for nonprofit ambulance and fire emergency services will decrease General Fund revenue by \$26,506 in fiscal year 1998-99. The corresponding decrease in dedicated revenue to the Local Government Fund for state-municipal revenue sharing will be \$1,424. The estimated reduction of General Fund revenue is \$30,312 in fiscal year 1999-2000, the first full year of implementation, with a corresponding loss of dedicated revenue to the Local Government Fund of \$1,629.
