Resolve, to Establish the Study Group on Pay Equity Among Providers of Mental Health and Mental Retardation Services.

Presented by Representative FARNSWORTH of Portland. Cosponsored by Representatives: COWGER of Hallowell, FULLER of Manchester, KANE of Saco, LEMAIRE of Lewiston, MITCHELL of Portland. **Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts and resolves of the 2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the study proposed in this resolve must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a report submitted to the next legislative session; and

10 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 12 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 14 safety; now, therefore, be it

16 Sec. 1. Study group established. Resolved: That the Study Group on Pay Equity Among Providers of Mental Health and Mental 18 Retardation Services, referred to in this resolve as the "study group," is established to study pay equity among providers of 20 mental health services and mental retardation services; and be it further

Sec. 2. Study group membership. Resolved: That the study group consists of the following 8 members appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives:

28 1. One member of the House of Representatives;

30 2. One member of the Senate;

 32 3. Two representatives from among the employees of the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance
34 Abuse Services, one representing mental health and one representing mental retardation;

Two providers of mental health services from the public
sector; and

40 5. Two providers of mental retardation services from the public sector; and be it further

Sec. 3. Appointments; meetings. **Resolved**: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the 44 effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the 46 Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. Within 15 days 48 of the appointment of all members, the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the study 50 group. The study group shall select a chair from among its members; and be it further

Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the study group shall study the issue of pay equity among providers of mental health services and mental retardation services; and be it further

Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the Department of Mental Health, Mental Retardation and Substance Abuse Services shall provide staffing assistance; and be it further

Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the study group shall serve without compensation or reimbursement of any type; and be it further

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the study group shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 118th Legislature no later than December 1, 1997. If the study group requires an extension, it may apply to the Legislative Council, which may grant the extension.

20 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

SUMMARY

This resolve establishes the Study Group on Pay Equity Among Providers of Mental Health and Mental Retardation Services.
