	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §2611, sub-§1, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 751,
4	§4, is amended to read:
6	1. State primary drinking water regulations. The commissioner shall promulgate adopt and enforce primary drinking
8	water regulations-which rules that are necessary to protect the public health and which-shall that apply to all public water
10	systems. Such regulations-shall rules must include:
12	A. Identification of contaminants which that may have an adverse effect on the health of persons;
14	B. Speeifies-for each contaminant, either:

18	(1) A maximum contaminant level that is acceptable in water for human consumption, if it is feasible to ascertain the level of such that contaminant in water

22	(2) One or more treatment techniques or methods which that lead to a reduction of the level of such that

Such regulations-shall rules may be no less stringent than the most recent National Primary Drinking Water Regulations in effect, as issued or promulgated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Regulations under this

subsection may be amended from time to time, as necessary.

for all public water supplies for methyl tert-butyl ether of 5
parts per billion.
