2	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7432, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1989, c. 913,
4	Pt. B, §6, is further amended to read:
6	2. Failure to visit traps. A person is guilty of failure to visit traps if that person:
8) While transing in our exercised on incommental plans
10	A. While trapping in any organized or incorporated place, fails to visit each trap, except under ice water sets for beaver and muskrat, or fails to cause the same to be visited
12	at least once in every calendar day, including Sunday;
14	B. While trapping in any unorganized or deorganized place, fails to visit each trap, except for leg hold traps set for
