An Act to Outlaw the Use of Eel Pots in Inland Waters.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §7153, sub-§1, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1995, c.
4	536, Pt. B, §2, is amended to read:
6	A. Eels may be harvested in inland waters using only ee l pets-er weirs.
8	Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §7153, sub-§2, as repealed and replaced by PL
10	1995, c. 536, Pt. B, $\S2$, is amended to read:
12	2. Fee. The minimum fee for an individual permit for alewives, suckers and yellow perch is \$42. Beginning in calendar
14	year 1996, a crew permit may be sold for alewives, suckers and yellow perch for \$100, authorizing up to 3 persons to engage in
16	the licensed activity. The annual fee for an-eel-pot-or a weir permit is \$100. An eelpot-or eel weir license is not
18	transferable.
20	Sec. 3. Effective date. This Act takes effect January 1, 1998.
22	SUMMARY

26	This bill prohibits the use of eel pots in inland waters. The effective date of this bill is postponed until January 1, 1998 so that persons possessing eel pot permits issued for
28	calendar year 1997 may lawfully fish for eels on inland waters using an eel pot until the expiration of that permit.
